Experiencing issues with the control boxes overheating so there will be expenses to replace and/or repair them as well as trying to find a way to protect them so this doesn't continue to happen. McDermott was there and they are continuing negotiations, within a reasonable timeframe, to come to an agreement or move forward with condemnation. Briefly

went over the Game and Parks agreement regarding the shared employee.
